When you plant pumpkin seeds outside, remember that pumpkins need an incredible amount of space to grow. It's recommended that you plan on a minimum of 20 square feet (2 sq. m.) being needed for each plant. When the soil temperature is at least 65 F. (18 C.), you can plant your pumpkin seeds. Step 2 - Place them in a propagator or seal the pots inside a plastic bag at a temperature of 20C (68F) until germination, which takes 5-7 days. Step 3 - Once germinated, grow pumpkin plants on for about 4 weeks until they are large enough to be ...
