For this video we used Lurch's 2008 Harley Street Glide and did the rear brake pads. The fronts are basically the same except they are dual front rotors. We used Harley brake kit #41852-08B. This kit also comes with a tube of brake paste. We show you where and how to apply that to the back of the brake pad plates.

How to Replace Brake Pads on a Harley with ABS - YouTube  
The brake system on the Harley Davidson Softail is a pressurized system that works with friction to stop your bike. After some driving, these components wear and get too thin, requiring them to be changed. Waiting too long to replace your brake pads will cost you your rotors, as they rub against them and wear them out as well.

Remove the brake pad from the caliper and squeeze the brake handle or foot pedal to force the piston out of the caliper. Clean the caliper pistons to remove any debris. Use the screwdriver to push the caliper piston all the way back into the caliper. Insert the new brake pads into the caliper.

How to Change Brake Pads on a Harley Heritage Softail | It ...  
Place a drain pan underneath the rear master cylinder. Apply pressure to the inside pad with a putty knife, forcing the brake caliper piston to retract. Force the piston to sufficiently retract so as to allow room to insert a new pad, if necessary. Pull out the two pad pins part of the way to drop the brake pads. Dispose of the worn brake pads.

How to Remove the Rear Brake Pads on a Harley-Davidson ...  
Install new pads and pad pin. The tab must engage the spring clip in the caliper housing. Tighten the pin to factory torque specs. Install caliper and tighten the bolt/pin to factory torque specs. Always remember to pump your brake lever. You need to have correct lever feel before attempting to ride. Before installing the master cylinder top cover, confirm that your brake fluid level is correct. Read the brake pad manufacturer's break in procedure before you ride.

Harley Davidson Brake Pads: Replace Rear Pads | FMH  
Slide the brake pads up out of the brake caliper and discard them. Apply a thin coat of brake pad lubricant to the backside of the new brake pads to keep them from squeaking in the future. Slide the pads into the brake caliper with the curved end towards the rear of the motorcycle. Run the brake pad holding pins into the mounting holes in the caliper, but do not tighten them. Slide the brake caliper back onto the rotor and tighten the two holding bolts with a 10mm wrench in a clockwise ...

Best Replacement Brake Pads For Harley Davidson Touring  
When rear brake pads on a Harley-Davidson Road King fall below 0.04 inch (1.02mm) in thickness, it is time to replace them. Loosen but do not remove the pad pins on the rear brake caliper using a 1/4 inch 12-point socket. Insert a putty knife between the inner pad and the caliper to force the caliper piston to retract.

Pump the rear brake peddle several times to completely seat both pads and allow the pads to come into contact with the brake rotor. Add D.O.T. 5 silicone brake fluid to the fill line in the rear brake master cylinder reservoir. Replace the master cylinder cover. Re-install the right-side saddlebag.

How to Replace the Brakes on a Harley Davidson Electra ...  
Unscrew the pair of brake pad pins on the back of the caliper using a socket wrench. Pull the brake pads and their retaining clip out from the caliper. Pull the brake pads off of the retaining clip. Place a new set of brake pads around the clip.
